

An Assessment of the Work Habits, Attitudes and Productivity of the Graduating Students in the College Department of La Consolacion University Philippines

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ABSTRACT

The focus of the study was the appraisal of the work habits, attitudes and productivity levels of the graduating students of La Consolacion University Philippines. The research was primarily a descriptive type which utilized a standardized tool measuring five areas namely: motivation, concentration, job satisfaction, productivity and work orientation. Respondents included 129 graduating students for academic year 2016-2017 from the different college departments namely: Allied Medical Sciences, Arts, Sciences and Education, Business Entrepreneurship and Accountancy, Information Technology and Engineering and Hospitality Management. Results revealed average tendencies of the respondents to exhibiting concentration when at work, being internally and externally motivated, expressing work satisfaction, being productive by avoiding distractions when working and being both systematic and organized in some aspects of their work and unsystematic and disorganized in other situations. The group of respondents from the College of Allied Medical Sciences had lesser distractions while the Information Technology and Engineering respondents expressed least satisfaction in terms of their work or career.
